## LA OUTDOOR STYLE

Los Angeles architect Michael Rachlin transforms the exterior of a 1950s California residence into a glamorous outdoor living space.

## IN 1994, THE NORTH-RIDGE EARTHQUAKE

rocked the Los Angeles area, making fixer-uppers of many of the region's 1950s-era bungalows.

For one such residence in LA's Beverlywood neighborhood, correcting the damage from the quake and the ensuing years of neglect called for a total makeover. Executed in two phases over a 20-year period by the homeowner himself—architect and designer Michael Rachlin—the project presented a formidable task.

A founding partner of the highly acclaimed Rachlin Partners, an architectural design firm in LA, Rachlin created a plan that included gutting the home's structure, leaving only the foundation, the exterior bearing walls and the roof. The outdoor

space also started from a blank slate, allowing him to take advantage of the location's panoramic views.

"Improving the outdoor living area was a vital part of renovating and upgrading an earthquake-damaged home," Rachlin says. "The scope was

to transform the backyard into a multifaceted living space including a pool, guest house and seating areas."

This transformation allowed Rachlin to achieve a serene environment ideally suited for private relaxation as well as casual social gatherings. "By combining amenities such as a pool and guest house with entertaining spaces like the deck with seating and a fire pit, the outdoor area gives a resort-like impression that's restful and replenishing," he says.

Rachlin added a freestanding gable and hipped roof structures throughout the property that mirror the lines of the cottage. The structures create separate outdoor "rooms," such as an al fresco dining area. A raised deck in a lush corner of the property also lends the perfect gathering space around an umbrella-covered bar. Casual furnishings provide a vantage point of the modern in-ground pool.

On an adjacent raised lounge patio, a modern gas fire feature serves as a cozy focal point. Surrounded by white furnishings, the fire pit is a prime spot for conversation. Designer chaise lounges flank the pool as part of the final leisure plan.

"The (exterior) design created a relationship between the outdoor and the indoor spaces, defined by ease of circulation and a strong visual connection," Rachlin says. "Outdoor elements such as the deck, pool and guest house are laid out to gently blur the distinction between minimalist interiors and the lushly landscaped exterior."

Mother Nature may have dealt a blow to this home, but through one designer's vision this quintessential California bungalow now stands as a shining example of true LA outdoor style.
